## Scholarship Awarding at Penn State

As a first-year student, you will discover that scholarship-awarding criteria at Penn State vary across campuses and academic colleges. The campus and college awarding charts on the following pages reference a variety of application or con-

sideration processes, eligibility requirements, and informational Web sites. We encourage you to explore the campus and college Web sites relevant to your academic interests and check them regularly for new information. The Office of Student

Aid, as the manager of Penn State's University-wide scholarships, automatically considers you for University-wide scholarships once you are offered admission to the University.

## Facts about University Scholarships

- One in five first-year students receive a University scholarship.
- Approximately 50 percent of first-year scholarship recipients are at University Park; 50 percent are at other campuses.
- Excellent scholastic records are a prerequisite for nearly all scholarships.
- Both Pennsylvania and non-Pennsylvania residents receive equal scholarship consideration.
- For maximum scholarship consideration, you should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on the Web ([www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov)). FAFSA results determine whether students demonstrate financial need. For first-year students, the recommended FAFSA completion date is February 15.
- Scholarship eligibility is frequently based on both merit **and** demonstrated financial need.
- Most scholarships require recipients to be full-time students (12 or more credits per semester).
- Scholarship award values are typically \$1,250–\$2,500 a year.
- College, campus, and administrative units award scholarships and notify their recipients by mail.

## Facts about Private Scholarships

- Many students receive scholarships from their high schools, community organizations, church groups, companies, and other private philanthropies.
- One in ten first-year students receive private scholarship support.
- You can search and apply for scholarships through free, Web-based search engines such as those found at [www.psu.edu/studentaid](http://www.psu.edu/studentaid).
- High-achieving Penn State students can also locate private scholarship opportunities through Penn State's Undergraduate Fellowships Office, [www.ufo.psu.edu](http://www.ufo.psu.edu).

## Scholarships at Penn State Campuses (other than University Park)

All Penn State campuses award scholarships to eligible first-year students based on academic performance, SAT scores, financial need (as determined by the FAFSA), leadership, and community

service. Every year, student financial aid offices at Penn State campuses other than University Park award \$1.5 million in scholarships to approximately 1,000 students. Scholarship award values range

from \$500 to \$2,500. Scholarship awarding begins as early as December and continues through July.

## Scholarships from Academic Colleges

A limited number of college scholarships are available to first-year students. College scholarship award values range from \$1,000 to \$5,000 per academic year. We

recommend that you familiarize yourself with the scholarship awarding practices in the academic areas of your interest.

Typically, college scholarship awarding begins in March and continues throughout the academic year.

## University-Wide Scholarship Programs

Note: The following scholarship programs are administered by the Office of Student Aid.

### Donor-Sponsored Scholarships

The Office of Student Aid awards scholarships from more than 300 individual donor-sponsored scholarship funds. The requirements for these scholarships are set by the donors and vary greatly.

For example, first-generation college attendance, graduation from the donor's high school, residence in a donor's county, demonstrated leadership, graduating in the top 5 percent of the class, or enrollment in a particular academic college are among the requirements of Penn State's donor-sponsored scholarships.

First-year student consideration is automatic and does not require a special application unless otherwise noted on the Office of Student Aid's Web site. Completing the FAFSA is essential for maximum consideration. The Office of Student Aid selects recipients and sends first-year scholarship award letters.

### Renaissance Scholarship Program

The Renaissance Fund was created with the belief that an education should be based on intellectual capability rather than financial ability. This unique scholarship program recognizes the brightest students whose financial need is the greatest. A nonprofit Renaissance Board composed of trustees, faculty, alumni, members at large, and current Renaissance scholars oversees Renaissance fund-raising and sets award values.

The Office of Student Aid identifies and selects eligible recipients. All first-year students who have completed the FAFSA are automatically considered for a Renaissance Scholarship.

*Annual scholarship amount:* \$1,250

*First-year scholarship recipients:* approximately 100

*Scholarship length:* Four years, if student maintains a minimum 3.0 GPA and continues to demonstrate financial need

*Notification:* March through August

### Bunton-Waller Fellows and Scholarship Program

The Bunton-Waller Fellows and Bunton-Waller Scholarships assist Penn State in creating a more diverse population. Factors such as economic disadvantage, geographic diversity, and ethnic/racial underrepresentation at Penn State place high-achieving students under consideration for these awards. For maximum consideration of all Bunton-Waller awards, students should complete the FAFSA. Eligible students will be identified and contacted by the Office of Student Aid.

*Annual fellows amount:*

Pennsylvania residents may receive a maximum of tuition, fees, and room and board inclusive of all grants and scholarships; non-Pennsylvania residents may receive a maximum of nonresident tuition.

*First-year fellows recipients:* 50

*Scholarship length:* Eight semesters, providing students meet renewal criteria

*Notification:* January through April

---

*Annual scholarship amount:* approximately 25 percent of in-state tuition

*First-year scholarship recipients:* 400

*Scholarship length:* One year, with consideration for future years

*Notification:* March through August

### Trustee Scholarship Program

The Trustee Scholarship Program is a departure from traditional philanthropy. Five percent of privately endowed scholarship gifts or pledges are matched with University funds committed by the Board of Trustees. Both the endowment earnings and the University matched funds are available to award to students demonstrating significant financial need and academic promise. The Office of Student Aid identifies eligible students. Academic colleges, campuses, and the Office of Student Aid all select recipients. All first-year students who have completed the FAFSA are automatically considered for a Trustee Scholarship.

*Annual scholarship amount:* \$1,250–\$2,750

*First-year scholarship recipients:* Approximately 800

*Scholarship length:* One year, with consideration for future years

*Notification:* March through August

### Alumni Association Chapter Scholarships

County, state, and international Penn State Alumni Association chapters sponsor Alumni Association Chapter Scholarships. Chapters nominate students identified by Penn State as residing in the chapter service areas. The Office of Student Aid awards and notifies recipients. Consideration for first-year students is automatic unless an individual chapter invites you to apply.

*Scholarship length:* One or two semesters

*Notification:* April–January

## Special Scholarship Programs

### Schreyer Honors College

The Schreyer Honors College, Penn State’s undergraduate honors program, offers merit-based, \$2,500-a-year Academic Excellence Scholarships. The scholarships are awarded to 300 first-year students admitted into the Schreyer Honors College. Students receive the scholarship for eight semesters, provided they meet Honors College requirements. This highly selective honors program requires excellent SAT scores and high school performance. Priority application deadline is November 30; final application deadline is March 30.

### National Merit Scholarships

Each year, Penn State sponsors five National Merit Scholarships, ranging from \$750 to \$2,000. To be considered, students must list Penn State as their first-choice school on the National Merit application no later than February. National Merit Corporation officially awards Penn State’s five school-sponsored awards in May. In addition, Penn State gives one-time \$1,000 recognition awards to all National Merit finalists who

select Penn State as their first-choice school on the National Merit application by May 1 and are not receiving any other National Merit award. In 2005–06, eighty-seven first-year Penn State students were National Merit finalists.

### Athletic Scholarships

Penn State offers athletic grants in twenty-nine varsity sports (fifteen men’s and fourteen women’s) at the University Park campus. The coach responsible for each sport awards the athletic grants available for that sport. Athletic scholarships are not available at other locations.

### Office for Disability Services Scholarships

The Office for Disability Services awards scholarship support to both first-year and upper-level students. Students must apply by April 30 each year via the Office for Disability Services Scholarship App-

lication form provided on the Web ([www.equity.psu.edu/ods](http://www.equity.psu.edu/ods)). Students must have disability documentation on file. Students who have completed the FAFSA receive maximum consideration.

### University Fellowships Office

The University Fellowships Office (UFO) is Penn State’s office for information on scholarships that are funded by sources outside of the University. The UFO provides guidance to undergraduate students interested in applying for scholarships, fellowships, and awards. The office provides support and services to graduate students interested in the U.S. Fulbright Student Program and/or the Deutscher Akademischer Austausch Dienst (DAAD) Grants.
