

LTCOL ROBERT A. AND LOIS BARRACLOUGH SCHOLARSHIP

1. NAME: The name of this scholarship shall be the "LtCol Robert A. and Lois Barraclough Scholarship."
2. PURPOSE: The purpose of this scholarship shall be to provide recognition and financial assistance to outstanding students planning to enroll at any campus of The Pennsylvania State University who have a demonstrated need for funds to meet their necessary college expenses.
3. AMOUNT OF FUND: Support for this scholarship has been contributed as gifts to The Pennsylvania State University for the above-stated purpose by Robert and Lois M. Barraclough. Additional contributions may be made by interested persons or organizations.
4. ELIGIBILITY: Consideration for this scholarship shall be given to all full-time undergraduate students planning to enroll at any campus of The Pennsylvania State University who have achieved outstanding academic records or who manifest promise of academic success; who have a demonstrated financial need; and, who are graduates of Bellefonte or Bald Eagle Area High Schools in Centre County, Pennsylvania.
5. SELECTION PROCEDURE: Recipients of this scholarship shall be selected by the Office of Student Aid Scholarship Committee from nominations submitted from the Bellefonte and Bald Eagle Area High Schools. One recipient shall be selected from each high school per year. The Selection Committee shall notify the appropriate high schools of the recipients' names in time for the award to be announced at the high schools' convocation ceremonies. The Office of Student Aid, which is responsible for ensuring compliance with regulations concerning federal, state, and other aid in accordance with University policy regarding academic scholarships under University control, shall be informed of all awards.
6. AMOUNT OF AWARD: The donors prefer that two awards be made per year; one award to an incoming freshman from Bellefonte High School and one to an incoming freshman from Bald Eagle Area High School. Each award is to be in the amount of \$1,000. In no case, however, shall the value of the scholarships awarded exceed the funds available for this purpose. Any available monies not awarded in a particular year shall be added to funds available for expenditure in the following year.
7. TERM OF AWARD: Each scholarship shall be awarded for one academic year and shall not be renewed.
8. AMENDMENT OR TERMINATION: The Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University, in consultation with the donors when possible, shall have the authority to make changes in these guidelines which are necessary to ensure the fulfillment of the above-stated objectives.

CHELIUS FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP IN METEOROLOGY

1. NAME: The name of this scholarship shall be the "Chelius Family Scholarship in Meteorology."
2. PURPOSE: The purpose of this scholarship shall be to recruit and/or retain the best and the brightest undergraduate students who are enrolled or planning to enroll in the Department of Meteorology in the College of Earth and Mineral Sciences at The Pennsylvania State University, by providing them with recognition and financial assistance.
3. AMOUNT OF FUND: The initial principal of this fund, \$100,000, has been contributed to The Pennsylvania State University for the above-stated purpose from the Estate of Helen H. Chelius. Additional contributions may be made by interested persons or organizations.
4. ELIGIBILITY: Consideration for this scholarship shall be given to all full-time undergraduate students enrolled or planning to enroll in the Department of Meteorology in the College of Earth and Mineral Sciences at The Pennsylvania State University who have achieved superior academic records or who manifest promise of outstanding academic success.
5. SELECTION PROCEDURE: Recipients of this scholarship shall be selected by the Dean of the College of Earth and Mineral Sciences or his/her designee. The Office of Student Aid, which is responsible for ensuring compliance with regulations concerning federal, state, and other aid in accordance with University policy regarding academic scholarships under University control, shall be informed of all awards.
6. AMOUNT OF AWARD: The number of scholarships awarded and the amount of each shall be determined by the Dean of the College of Earth and Mineral Sciences. The amount of each award shall preferably be not less than \$1,000. Scholarships shall be awarded annually in accordance with the University endowment spending policy and shall conform to existing University policy. Any available monies not awarded in a particular year shall either be added to the principal or retained for award together with the monies available for expenditure in the following year, as determined by the Dean, College of Earth and Mineral Sciences.
7. TERM OF AWARD: Each scholarship shall be awarded for one academic year and may be renewed for subsequent years providing the recipient continues to meet the conditions of eligibility and funds are available.
8. ENDOWMENT MANAGEMENT: This endowment shall be subject to general guidelines and policies adopted by the Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University for the management of endowed funds. Stability of endowment support and preservation of purchasing power against inflationary pressures shall be achieved by limiting spending to a specified percentage of the annually-determined market value of the fund. As authorized by the Board of Trustees, the University's Investment Council monitors and administers annual endowment spending. Any investment returns in excess of the designated spending rate are retained in the principal of the fund and reflected in its market value.
9. AMENDMENT: The Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University, in consultation with the donors when possible, shall have the authority to make changes in these guidelines which are necessary to ensure the fulfillment of the above-stated objectives.

CHARLES L. AND ANNA R. HOSLER SCHOLARSHIP IN METEOROLOGY

1. NAME: The name of this scholarship shall be the "Charles L. and Anna R. Hosler Scholarship in Meteorology."
2. PURPOSE: The purpose of this scholarship shall be to provide merit-based scholarships designed to attract and retain an outstanding group of graduate and undergraduate students who have a demonstrated financial need and who are enrolled or planning to enroll in the Department of Meteorology in the College of Earth and Mineral Sciences. These students shall be known as the "Charles and Anna Hosler Scholars" and will include the College's most talented students. Students who qualify for the Schreyer Scholars will be eligible.
3. AMOUNT OF FUND: The initial principal of this fund was previously contributed to The Pennsylvania State University for the above-stated purpose by Charles L. and Anna R. Hosler. Additional contributions may be made by interested persons or organizations.
4. ELIGIBILITY: Consideration for this scholarship shall be given to all full-time graduate and undergraduate students enrolled or planning to enroll in the the Department of Meteorology in the College of Earth and Mineral Sciences at The Pennsylvania State University who have achieved superior academic records or who manifest promise of outstanding academic success and who have a demonstrated financial need. Students who qualify for the Schreyer Scholars will be eligible.
5. SELECTION PROCEDURE: Recipients of this scholarship shall be selected by the Dean of the College of Earth and Mineral Sciences upon the recommendation of the Head, Department of Meteorology. The Office of Student Aid, which is responsible for ensuring compliance with regulations concerning federal, state, and other aid in accordance with University policy regarding academic scholarships under University control, shall be informed of all awards.
6. AMOUNT OF AWARD: The number of scholarships awarded and the amount of each shall be determined by the Dean, College of Earth and Mineral Sciences upon the recommendation of the Head, Department of Meteorology. The amount of each award shall preferably be not less than \$1,000. Scholarships shall be awarded annually in accordance with the University endowment spending policy and shall conform to existing University policy. Any available monies not awarded in a particular year shall either be added to the principal or retained for award together with the monies available for expenditure in the following year, as determined by Dean of the College of Earth and Mineral Sciences.
7. TERM OF AWARD: Each scholarship shall be awarded for one academic year and may be renewed for subsequent years providing the recipient continues to meet the conditions of eligibility and funds are available. However, a student may receive the scholarship for a maximum of eight semesters.
8. ENDOWMENT MANAGEMENT: This endowment shall be subject to general guidelines and policies adopted by the Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University for the management of endowed funds. Stability of endowment support and preservation of purchasing power against inflationary pressures shall be achieved by limiting spending to a specified percentage of the annually-determined market value of the fund. As authorized by the Board of Trustees, the University's Investment Council monitors and administers annual endowment spending. Any investment returns in excess of the designated spending rate are retained in the principal of the fund and reflected in its market value.
9. AMENDMENT: The Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University, in consultation with the donors when possible, shall have the authority to make changes in these guidelines which are necessary to ensure the fulfillment of the above-stated objectives.

1. NAME: The name of this award shall be the "Anita and David Lipson Award."

5. SELECTION PROCEDURE: Recipients of this award shall be selected by the Penn State Delaware County Scholarship Committee. The Office of Student Aid, which is responsible for ensuring compliance with regulations concerning federal, state, and other aid in accordance with University policy regarding academic scholarships under University control, shall be informed of all awards.
6. AMOUNT OF AWARD: The number of awards made and the amount of each shall be determined by the Selection Committee. Awards shall be made annually in accordance with the University endowment spending policy and shall conform to existing University policy. Any available monies not awarded in a particular year shall be added to the principal.
7. TERM OF AWARD: Each award shall be for one academic year. Further extraordinary academic accomplishments by a recipient may enable that recipient to again be considered for this award.
8. ENDOWMENT MANAGEMENT: This endowment shall be subject to general guidelines and policies adopted by the Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University for the management of endowed funds, including the application of fees associated with endowment administration. Stability of endowment support and preservation of purchasing power against inflationary pressures shall be achieved by limiting spending to a specified percentage of the annually-determined market value of the fund. As authorized by the Board of Trustees, the University's Investment Council monitors and administers annual endowment spending. Any investment returns in excess of the designated spending rate are retained in the principal of the fund and reflected in its market value.
9. AMENDMENT: The Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University, in consultation with the donors when possible, shall have the authority to make changes in these guidelines which are the fulfillment of the above-stated objectives.

HELEN AND LOWELL MANFULL THEATRE SCHOLARSHIP

1. NAME: The name of this scholarship shall be the "Helen and Lowell Manfull Theatre Scholarship."
2. PURPOSE: The purpose of this scholarship shall be to provide recognition and financial assistance to outstanding juniors enrolled in the School of Theatre in the College of Arts and Architecture at The Pennsylvania State University who demonstrate academic excellence by achieving a minimum 3.25 grade point average (on a 4.0 scale) and have demonstrated outstanding commitment through active participation in any phase of School of Theatre productions.
3. AMOUNT OF FUND: The principal of this fund, \$50,000, will be contributed to The Pennsylvania State University for the above-stated purpose by Helen A. and Lowell L. Manfull as well as from friends and family. Additional contributions may be made by interested persons or organizations.
4. ELIGIBILITY: Consideration for this scholarship shall be given to all full-time junior students enrolled in the School of Theatre in the College of Arts and Architecture at The Pennsylvania State University who demonstrate academic excellence by achieving a minimum 3.25 grade point average (on a 4.0 scale) and have demonstrated outstanding commitment through active participation in School of Theatre productions.
5. SELECTION PROCEDURE: Recipients of this scholarship shall be selected by the School of Theatre Scholarship Selection Committee. The Office of Student Aid, which is responsible for ensuring compliance with regulations concerning federal, state, and other aid in accordance with University policy regarding academic scholarships under University control, shall be informed of all awards.
6. AMOUNT OF AWARD: There shall be one scholarship awarded each year and the amount shall be determined by the School of Theatre Scholarship Selection Committee. As the endowment grows, the Selection Committee may award more than one scholarship as long as each scholarship is a substantial amount. The scholarship shall be awarded annually in accordance with the University endowment spending policy and shall conform to existing University policy. Any available monies not awarded in a particular year shall be added to the principal.
7. TERM OF AWARD: The scholarship shall be awarded for one academic year and shall not be renewed.
8. ENDOWMENT MANAGEMENT: This endowment shall be subject to general guidelines and policies adopted by the Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University for the management of endowed funds. Stability of endowment support and preservation of purchasing power against inflationary pressures shall be achieved by limiting spending to a specified percentage of the annually-determined market value of the fund. As authorized by the Board of Trustees, the University's Investment Council monitors and administers annual endowment spending. Any investment returns in excess of the designated spending rate are retained in the principal of the fund and reflected in its market value.
9. AMENDMENT: The Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University, in consultation with the donors when possible, shall have the authority to make changes in these guidelines which are necessary to ensure the fulfillment of the above-stated objectives.

ISAAC H. AND JEANETTE NOVACK SCHOLARSHIP AT PENN STATE ABINGTON

1. NAME: The name of this scholarship shall be the "Isaac H. and Jeanette Novack Scholarship at Penn State Abington."
2. PURPOSE: The purpose of this scholarship shall be to provide recognition and financial assistance to outstanding undergraduate students enrolled or planning to enroll as business or science majors at Penn State Abington.
3. AMOUNT OF FUND: Support for this scholarship shall be contributed as annual minimum \$2,500 gifts, for a period of at least five years, to The Pennsylvania State University for the above-stated purpose by Dr. and Mrs. Sheldon Novack. Additional contributions may be made by interested persons or organizations.
4. ELIGIBILITY: Consideration for this scholarship shall be given to all full-time undergraduate students enrolled or planning to enroll as business or science majors at Penn State Abington who manifest promise of outstanding academic success. To the extent permitted by law, first preference shall be given to first generation American students or the children of first generation Americans.
5. SELECTION PROCEDURE: Recipients of this scholarship shall be selected by the Penn State Abington Scholarship Committee. The Office of Student Aid, which is responsible for ensuring compliance with regulations concerning federal, state, and other aid in accordance with University policy regarding academic scholarships under University control, shall be informed of all awards.
6. AMOUNT OF AWARD: Only one scholarship shall be awarded per year and the amount gifted shall be no less than \$2,500.00 and no more than \$5,000.00. In no case, however, shall the value of the scholarships awarded exceed the funds available for this purpose. Any available monies not awarded in a particular year shall be added to funds available for expenditure in the following year.
7. TERM OF AWARD: Each scholarship shall be awarded for one academic year and may be renewed for subsequent years provided the recipient continues to meet the conditions of eligibility and funds are available.
8. AMENDMENT OR TERMINATION: The Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University, in consultation with the donor when possible, shall have the authority to make changes in these guidelines which are necessary to ensure the fulfillment of the above-stated objectives. Annual funding may be terminated upon written notice by either the donor or the Board of Trustees, not later than March 1, of the year the scholarship is to be awarded.

HARRY ADLER AND LOUIS COPPERSMITH MEMORIAL RENAISSANCE SCHOLARSHIP

1. NAME: The name of this scholarship shall be the "Harry Adler and Louis Coppersmith Memorial Renaissance Scholarship."
2. PURPOSE: The purpose of this scholarship shall be to provide financial assistance to promising full-time undergraduate and graduate students enrolled or planning to enroll at the University who have a proven need for funds to meet their necessary college expenses.
3. AMOUNT/SOURCE OF FUNDS: The initial principal of this fund, approximately \$19,125, has been contributed to The Pennsylvania State University for the above-stated purpose by friends, colleagues, and family in honor of John E. Sheehan, who was saluted by the Penn State Club of the Greater Johnstown Area for his outstanding community leadership at the June 12, 1986, Renaissance Dinner. John E. Sheehan requested that the scholarship be named to honor two people who made an impact on his life and the communities in which they lived. Additional contributions may be made by interested persons or organizations.
4. ELIGIBILITY: Consideration for this scholarship shall be given to all full-time Associate and Baccalaureate, and Graduate Degree Program students who are currently enrolled or planning to enroll at the University who have achieved outstanding academic records or who manifest promise of academic success and who have a proven financial need. First preference shall be given to students whose home address of record is Cambria County or Somerset County, Pennsylvania.
5. SELECTION PROCEDURE: Recipients of this scholarship shall be selected by the Scholarship Selection Committee of the Renaissance Fund. The Office of Student Aid, which is responsible for ensuring compliance with regulations concerning federal, state, and other aid in accordance with University policy regarding academic scholarships under University control, shall be informed of all awards.
6. AMOUNT OF AWARD: The number of scholarships awarded and the amount of each shall be determined by the Renaissance Fund's Executive Committee. Scholarships shall be awarded annually in accordance with the University endowment spending policy and shall conform to existing University policy. Any available monies not awarded in a particular year shall be added to the principal.
7. TERM OF AWARD: Each scholarship shall be awarded for one academic year and shall be renewed by the Selection Committee if the recipient continues to meet the conditions of eligibility and funds are available.
8. ENDOWMENT MANAGEMENT: This endowment shall be subject to general guidelines and policies adopted by the Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University for the management of endowed funds, including the application of fees associated with endowment administration. Stability of endowment support and preservation of purchasing power against inflationary pressures shall be achieved by limiting spending to an annually determined spending rate based on the market value of the fund. As authorized by the Board of Trustees, the University's Investment Committee monitors and administers annual endowment spending. Any investment returns in excess of the designated spending rate are retained in the principal of the fund and reflected in its market value.
9. AMENDMENT: The Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University, in consultation with the donor when possible, shall have the authority to make changes in these guidelines which are necessary to ensure the fulfillment of the above-state objectives.

**RAYMOND G. AND DIANA L. TRONZO MEDICAL INFORMATICS ENDOWMENT IN THE COLLEGE
OF INFORMATION SCIENCES AND TECHNOLOGY**

1. **NAME:** The name of this endowment shall be the "Raymond G. and Diana L. Tronzo Medical Informatics Endowment in the College of Information Sciences and Technology."
2. **PURPOSE:** The purpose of this endowment shall be to enrich the College of Information Sciences and Technology, The Pennsylvania State University, by providing monies to engage 1ST faculty and students in the issues and technologies associated with medical informatics.

Medical informatics is a developing body of knowledge and a set of techniques concerning the organizational management of information in support of medical research, education, and patient care. Medical informatics combines medical science with several technologies and disciplines in the information and computer sciences and provides methodologies by which these can contribute to better use of the medical knowledge base and ultimately to better medical care. Areas of study and research may include, but shall not be limited to, such topics as:

- The use of hand-held technology in conveying web-based clinical information;
- The use of interactive image technologies;
- The use of medical information technology in communities of diverse socioeconomic status; and,
- The patterns and use of medical information obtained by the patient in the digital age.

3. **AMOUNT OF FUND:** The initial principal of this fund, \$200,000, is expected to be contributed to The Pennsylvania State University for the above-stated purpose by Raymond G. and Diana L. Tronzo. Dr. and Mrs. Tronzo have already made a seed gift of \$50,000 to launch research envisioned in the field of medical informatics to the College of Information Sciences and Technology. Additional contributions may be made by interested persons or organizations.
4. **EXPENDITURES:** Expenditures shall conform to existing University policy. Expenditures shall be determined by the Dean of the College of Information Sciences and Technology or his/her designee, and shall be made to engage Information Sciences and Technology faculty and students in the issues and technologies associated with medical informatics. The Office of Student Aid, which is responsible for ensuring compliance with regulations concerning federal, state, and other aid in accordance with University policy regarding academic scholarships under University control, shall be informed of all awards.

Any available monies not awarded in a particular year shall either be added to the principal or retained for award together with the monies available for expenditure in the following year, as determined by the Dean of the College of Information Sciences and Technology.

5. **ENDOWMENT MANAGEMENT:** This endowment shall be subject to general guidelines and policies adopted by the Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University for the management of endowed funds. Stability of endowment support and preservation of purchasing power against inflationary pressures shall be achieved by limiting spending to a specified percentage of the annually-determined market value of the fund. As authorized by the Board of Trustees, the University's Investment Council monitors and administers annual endowment spending. Any investment returns in excess of the designated spending rate are retained in the principal of the fund and reflected in its market value.
6. **AMENDMENT:** The Board of Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University, in consultation with the donor when possible, shall have the authority to make changes in these guidelines which are necessary to ensure the fulfillment of the above-stated objectives.
